The International Truth and Justice Project (ITJP) filed 4 universal jurisdiction lawsuits against a retired Sri Lankan General, Jagath Jayasuriya, in August 2017. He is alleged to bear individual criminal responsibility as commander for war crimes and crimes against humanity that were committed by the military units under his command.

Freedom From Torture provides therapy and medical evidence to torture survivors living in the UK and we protect and promote torture survivors' rights. The largest case load of survivors the organisation sees is from Sri Lanka.

"THE HIGH COMMISSIONER WAS DEEPLY CONCERNED OVER SERIOUS ALLEGATIONS IN FOREIGN MEDIA ABOUT ONGOING ABDUCTIONS, EXTREME TORTURE AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE AS RECENTLY AS IN 2016 AND 2017. OHCHR IS EXPLORING OPTIONS OF HOW BEST TO PURSUE FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS OF THESE ALLEGATIONS".

"IT IS URGENT FOR THE SAKE OF THE VICTIMS THAT PROGRESS BE MADE ON ACCOUNTABILITY AND TRANSITIONAL JUSTICE. IN THE ABSENCE OF SUCH PROGRESS I WOULD ENCOURAGE MEMBER STATES TO EXPLORE THE USE OF UNIVERSAL JURISDICTION".
